The new members, brothers William Sidney Price Jr, Carter Price, and Harry Hemphill Price are along with Compatriot Bill

Price descendants of John service in 1782 as a drover Hudnall (1763-1844) of Bedford County, Virginia. Their patriot ancestor served two militia from 1780 to 1781. His service included duty near Portsmouth and Norfolk, Virginia during the spring of 1781 as Lord Cornwallis moved north from North Carolina to Yorktown. He also performed patriotic


