The Color Guard continues to make impressions on all that see them perform. Before Memorial Day ceremonies at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery, your Color Guard led the way for Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and other volunteer youth and adults in placing 100,000 flags to honor our Veterans who are buried there. On June 18th, we joined the Boerne Chapter Color Guard for the Burgess Fest Parade giving SAR another opportunity to show our colors and present our organization to the public.

A new Program is being established at the Wounded Warrior Center, BAMC where our wounded warriors and families will be able to trace 5 generations of their families, thanks to Ancestory. They are providing a Library Copy of their genealogical programs to help our military to focus on other things in their healing and recovery time. We need volunteers to help teach them to use this research program once a month. Volunteers will be trained in the use of Ancestory.Com.

July brings our SAR National Congress where San Antonio will received an award for being the BEST CHAPTER in the NATION. I am the only candidate for Chaplain General and will join a talented team of Leaders for this coming year. Many other NSSAR awards, ribbons and streamers will be presented to the San Antonio Chapter during the TXSSAR Board of Managers' Meeting that will be held on July 29-30 in Houston, Texas. CHAPTER CELEBRATES MEMORIAL DAY

On May 27th our chapter participated in the Opening Ceremony of the Scouts Annual Flag Placement Event at the National Cemetery at Ft. Sam Houston, TX. The VA had provided small (3X5 inch) US flags for the scouts from the San Antonio Area to place beside all 100,000 Veterans' Grave Markers in the cemetery.

The event honors all veterans who have served our country throughout pervious and current wars. Shown at the right is our Chapter's Color Guard with some of the Cub Scouts. Chapter Makes Presentation at Harris Middle School: Mr. Josh Duelm, a History teacher from Harris Middle School (NEISD), invited our Chapter to make a presentation to 40 of his students on May 25th. Compatriot Jay Lewallen offered several Revolutionary Period topics from which Mr. Duelm selected two topics for presentation to his History Classes. Compatriot Frank Rohrbough spoke on "Washington's Spies" and the critical role that spies of General Washington played during the Revolution. Special focus was given to how the "Culper Spy Ring" gathered intelligence on the British while they occupied New York City from 1776 to 1781. Compatriot Lewallen focused on the uniforms of the revolution as worn by the militia and the Continental Army. He explained how the uniforms evolved from the early years of the war to the establishment of a standard uniform by General Washington during the winter encampment at Valley Forge in 1778. Special attention was given to the differences of the musket (short range) and the rifle (long range) on the battlefield. The advantages and disadvantages of each weapon continue to draw discussions and debate among our compatriots.

NSSAR Online Store Reopens. On May 19th, President General J. David Sympson asked the following be passed to all Compatriots. His message reads: "I would like to announce to you after a two and a half month absence, the NSSAR Merchandise Store is back online. The Store can be found at http://store.sar.org, or by going to the "Compatriots" tab on www.sar.org, and then selecting SAR Store found at the bottom of the list. The "new" store went online Sunday May 15th, and has been operational since. The "new" store has several improvements, and will make life easier for our members. One of the new features allows you to search www.sar.org for a product by title or SKU# and find it on the store website. One of the biggest new benefits of the "new" store is the use of a single set of login credentials. If you have a user account on www.sar.org, you can (and should) use that to login at the store at check out. You will no longer have to remember a separate set of login credentials for the 2 different websites (http://store.sar.org and www.sar.org). If you did have a set of login credentials for the old store site (prior to March 2011) those will no longer function, and you should "throw them out". Chapter Recognizes Floresville Teacher





She was selected by her District Managers because of her sustained and exceptional performance in the classroom setting - teaching 8th grade students and helping them discover the legacy of liberty

that the first Patriots bravely bequeathed America. Mrs. McReynolds offered some comments on what it means to be a teacher revealing her passion for teaching and for the development of her students. One of her favorite quotes is: "Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it" by George Santayana. Mrs. McReynolds is Chairman of the Social Studies Department, the department in which History is taught.

PASSING OF CHAPTER COMPATRIOTS

Two Compatriots are Laid to Rest at Ft. Sam Houston:

- Compatriot COL Perry Hummel Burnham NSSAR # 62731, Died 4 November 2010; his funeral and internment was conducted at the Ft. Sam Houston on Thursday, May 26th, 2011, at Ft. Sam Houston. The church service was held in the Main Chapel at Ft. Sam at 10 AM, followed by a "committal service" at the National Cemetery at Ft. Sam Houston at 11:45 a.m. with full military honors. Perry's wife, Madeline Albers Burnham, passed away on October 7, 2008. Both urns containing their ashes were placed in a niche in the columbarium. Compatriot Burnham was admitted to membership in the National Society. Sons
 - Compatriot Burnham was admitted to membership in the National Society, Sons of the American Revolution on 11 November 1943 and simultaneously was granted membership in the Utah Society, Sons of the American Revolution, before transferring to the Texas Society on 18 January 1978. At the church services, President Taylor read and then presented the family our Memorial Resolution. He was an active member of the San Antonio Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, and during that 32 years participated in the activities of the chapter, thereby contributing to its success, and has been recognized as an Honorary Chapter President since 1998. Compatriot Burnham has received the SAR War Service Medal, the SAR Meritorious Service Medal (2), the SAR Silver Good Citizenship Medal, the SAR Bronze Good Citizenship Medal (2), and the TXSSAR Bronze Service Medal (3).
- Compatriot Gilbert Trevino was laid to rest at Fort Sam National Cemetery on 1 July 2011 at 1:30 PM when he received full military honors. A memorial service was held for him on 4 April 2011 at The Towers where he lived. Compatriot Trevino was an active member of the San Antonio Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution since gaining membership in SAR in September 2001. Compatriot Trevino was recognized for his service with the SAR War Service Medal with WWII device, the SAR Outstanding Citizenship Award, and with Certificates of Appreciation for support of the SAR JROTC program, thereby contributing to the success of the Chapter. Several of our members attended the internment services as requested by his wife and in honor of his service to our country and to our Chapter and the Sons of the American Revolution. A copy of a Memorial Resolution was presented to Mrs. Trevino at the Internment.
