

## GUEST SPEAKER ADDRESSES "ON MAKING A CONSTITUTION"

Our Guest Speaker for the September 17th Chapter Meeting was Law Professor Michael Ariens from St. Mary's University. He was introduced by Compatriot Bill Clanton. Professor Ariens' topic of "On Making a Constitution" challenges the imagination on just how

did the Founding Father's decide to write a "Constitution" for our new country following the War of Independence from Great Britain in the fall of 1781. The question Professor Ariens laid before us was - "Where

did the ideas come from that should be included in a Constitution?" No other nation on earth had ever written one based on the idea of freedoms of independent peoples. More importantly, "how was the process to be completed?" to start the process, the Articles of Confederation were ratified by the state in July 1781. In the end, it took almost six years for the new states to convene a Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia on May 14, 1787; it concluded its work on September 17th of that year. There was considerable debate about the roles and duties of the executive, legislative, and judicial branches, states rights versus national law and the need for a Bill of Rights guaranteeing certain freedoms not addressed in the Constitution. It took effect in 1789 after it was ratified by the 10 of the 12 States and fully ratified by the remaining two states in May 1790.To say the least, Professor Ariens' presentation was thought-provoking and informative. ### SASAR Celebrates Gala Remembering Victory at the Battle of Yorktown and Honoring Our Vietnam War Veterans

The Chapter celebrated its Gala Banquet on Saturday, October 18th at the Petroleum Club at 6:00 P.M. The primary purpose of this social event was fulfilled

by remembering the events of the Battle of Yorktown when Lt General Charles Cornwallis surrendered to General George Washington on October 17, 1781. This historic victory led to the founding of our Nation and our Independence from King George III of England.

Compatriot (Colonel) Joseph Ware gave an impressive and inspiring presentation commemorating the Victory of the Battle of Yorktown on October 17, 1781 by General George Washington's American Combined Forces over the British Army Commanded by General Lord Cornwallis.

To add to the celebration, we raffled a Collection of Fine Wines and Chocolates Basket (valued at \$250); The winner was our Guest Dorothy Perez, sister of Compatriot Reuben Perez.

One of the featured events of this Gala was to honor members and their families who served during the Vietnam War Era. As a matter of background, on May 28, 2012, President Barrack Obama inaugurated the "Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War" and called upon Federal, State and local officials to honor our Vietnam veterans, our fallen, our wounded, those unaccounted for, our former prisoners of war, their families and all who served with appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities." President General Joe Dooley, National Society of SAR announced its Partnership in the Program at the 124th Congress in Greenville, SC in July 2014. The Texas Society because a Partner Organization in early October of this year and President Robert Cohen has asked all Texas SAR Chapters to become a Partner Organizations.

We conducted our Chapter's first event celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War Commemoration Program where our members who served during the Vietnam War Era were recognized and honored. Veterans were asked to assemble under the DOD Commemorative Flag. Each of the

twenty veterans present were announced individually and presented the 50th Anniversary Commemorative "Veterans" Pin by President Hancock. Two of these veterans were wives who served as nurses during the Vietnam War Era.

Our Special Guest was Colonel (USAF Ret) Donald Spoon, who was an F-4 pilot during the Vietnam War who was shot down on January 21, 1967 and was a Prisoner of War for six years.

Other events held during the Gala include inductions and some Awards.

One of the highlights of the evening was the induction of three members to the San Antonio Chapter, Texas SAR. They were James Griffin, Harris Leonard and his son Jett. Compatriot Griffin's patriots ancestor was Joseph Culpepper, 1<sup>st</sup> LT in the First South Carolina Regiment of State Dragoons. The Leonard's came into the SAR under their patriot ancestor Lazarus Reeves who was a Sergeant with Francis Marion, the Swamp Fox. On June 21, 1775, Marion was commissioned Captain in the 2nd South Carolina Regiment under General William Moultrie. In Sept 1776, the Continental Congress commissioned Marion as a Lieutenant Colonel. Marion was known for his



guerrilla tactics in fighting the British. (At Left)) Former

#### **Induction of New Members**

At the September 17th Chapter Meeting, President Robert Hancock inducted Compatriots Bradford Hornbuckle and Dustin Whittenburg into the San Antonio Chapter and the Texas SAR.

Compatriot Hornbuckle's patriot ancestor was Richard Fletcher of Virginia.

Compatriot Whittenburg's patriot ancestor is Lewis Holloway who was a Sergeant in Georgia Regiment of the Continental Army. He fought and was taken as a prisoner in the Siege of Charleston (March 29th to May 12, 1780).

The **Battle of Charleston** was one of the major battles of the Revolution where Major General Benjamin Lincoln surrendered Continental Forces numbering about 5,000 to the British. Later as Second in Command to General Washington, General Lincoln accepted the
