PRESIDENT RECOGNIZES LOCAL HEROES

At our Chapter Meeting on November 16th, President Hancock recognized a local family in presenting each of them the SAR Heroism Medal and Certificate.

Shown below are Shawn, Angela and son Tyler who put themselves at great risk to recover three children from a overturned and burning car on February 16, 2015 in the Boerne TX area. The Citation for the Award reads in part: "Mr Hudson acted with bravery when he observed that two girls (age 8 and 3) were at the scene and had been thrown out of the vehicle. He asked for his wife to call 911 for help. Mr. Hudson quickly observed that an older girl (aged 14 year) was trapped inside the vehicle. Without concern for their own safety, Mr. Hudson and his son Tyler worked to rescue the girl from inside the car.

Moments later, Mr. Hudson focused on the 3 year old girl who was pinned beneath the front of the car. Mr.

Hudson, his wife Angela and son Tyler tried to lift the car to remove the young girl from under the car. Unable to do so, Mr. Hudson ran to the highway to flag down another motorist to assist in rescuing the girl. Although the car was now on fire, the four rescuers, without hesitation or consideration for their own safety, miraculously lifted the vehicle to the extent that Angela was able to remove the girl from the danger to safety. Mr. Hudson, Angela and Tyler continued to give aid to the three girls until medical personnel arrived."

Shawn's reason for accepting the Heroism Award was to invite others to "not be afraid to help others when others are in need of help."

He stated that "that every day the department responds to life-threatening events that requires the response of the Fire Department which frequently results in the saving of human lives." He spoke of the challenges facing the Fire Department to include arson investigation and the efforts taken to determine the cause of building fires. Following his presentation President Hancock presented Chief Steele the SAR Bronze Commendation Medal

PUBLIC SAFTEY AWARDS PRESENTED TO LOCAL OFFICERS

At the November 18th Chapter Meeting President Hancock presented Three Public Service Awards for Fire Safety, Emergence Medical Service and Heroism Award.

The first two Awards were given to Firefighters of the San Antonio Fire Department. Firefighter Omar E. Mercado was presented the SAR Emergency Medical Service Commendation Medal. The Citation reads:

"Fire Fighter Omar E. Mercado has contributed to the success of the San Antonio Fire Department. His knowledge and work ethic is a positive example to everyone he meets. Fire Fighter Mercado entered the San Antonio Fire Department on 1 October 2007. He has served the citizens of San Antonio as a firefighter in the Fire Suppression Division and is currently assigned to Engine 28A. Fire Fighter Mercado's dedication to duty and service is reflected in his daily actions. On 28 December 2014, Fire Fighter Mercado was initial triage and treatment for victims being removed from the third alarm structure fire at the Wedgewood Apartments. His training and responsive thinking allowed him to prevent death, minimize pain and ensure the safety of those victims he encountered.

Fire Fighter Mercado has brought strong service to the San Antonio Fire Department. His actions saved lives and provided for the welfare of those he treats, this reflects great credit on Himself, the San Antonio Fire Department and the Citizens of San Antonio." (Photo at Left) Our second Public Safety Award recipient was the crew of Engine 28 A. The Citation to Accompany the Award reads: "Engine 28 A Shift has distinguished itself and the San Antonio Fire Department through the actions of Captain Christopher M. Casals, Acting Engineer Omar E. Mercado, Fire Fighter Roland G. Castro, and Fire Fighter Christopher M. Fink on 28 December 2014. The Crew of Engine 28A was the first San Antonio Fire Department apparatus on a mutual aid request by Castle Hills Fire Department at the Wedgewood Apartment Complex third alarm structure fire. Engine 28 arrived on the scene to find an 11 story geriatric apartment complex with multiple floors on fire and numerous residents in danger. Engine 28 entered the burning structure and assumed Lobby Sector Command of the structure housing approximately 120 geriatric residents. From the Lobby Engine 28 was able to oversee the extrication of victims from the above floors and initial medical care for residents. Fire Fighters Mercado, Castro and Fink provided the hands on care to both victims and firefighters allowing for safe entry and egress. They controlled the elevator and the alarm panel allowing for an organized and controlled effort. Their professionalism brought order to a chaotic situation allowing for a safe mitigation of the event. It is this commitment and dedication to Service and to Fire Safety that resonates from Engine 28A, Captain Casals and

those he leads. These actions reflect great credit on Himself, the Firemen serving on Engine 28, the San Antonio Fire Department and the Citizens of San Antonio."

FEATURED SPEAKER FOR DECEMBER MEETING



President Hancock was our Featured Speaker for our December 16th Chapter Meeting. His subject of his presentation was "Patriot in Purple—John Hancock". His talk was information taken from the book - same title, by Hebert S Allen.

John Hancock was born on June 23, 1737 in Cambridge Mass. His father was also, a John Hancock and was a minister. It was interesting to note that there were at least eight generations of John Hancock's and they were all ministers until our Patriot. John was raised from his early teens to adulthood by his wealthy uncle, Adam Hancock in Boston. Adam was a import/export merchant. He taught John the tools of the trade and John also became immensely wealthy. He had his own dock and a large fleet of ships. He became known as "The Prince of Merchant".

John Hancock was one of our founding Fathers, who contributed a large portion of his wealth, to win our Independence. He is well known for being the first to sign the Declaration of Independence. In doing so, he said "John Bull

(King George the third) will not need his Spectacles to read my name", for that, King George put a 400 pound bounty on Mr. Hancock - dead or captured! John Hancock was President of the Second Congenital Congress when the Declaration of Independence was drafted and approved. He and its secretary, Charles Thompson, immediately signed the handwritten draft, which was sent to a nearby printer for printing. On July 19, Congress decided to produce a hand written copy with all the delegates signature. "Secretary Thompson assistant, Philadelphia Quaker and Merchant Timothy Matlock, penned the draft." The public was not made aware of who signed the Declaration of Independence, until January 18,1777.

John Hancock was elected the first Governor of Massachusetts. His goal was to be the President of the newly established United States but he died October 8, 1793 at the young age of 57, before he could realize his goal.

FOUR NEW MEMBERS INDUCTED

President Hancock inducted four new members to the Chapter—one at the November 18th Chapter Meeting and

three more at the December 16th Chapter Meeting.

In November, President Hancock inducted Compatriot Craig Bertolett into the Texas Society and our Chapter.

Compatriot Bertolett is a retired US Army Colonel having served for 14 year Active Duty and 16 years in the Army Reserves. His area of service included Armor and Ordinance in Germany and Korea. He then served as an Intelligence Officer later in his Army career.

Compatriot Bertolett's Patriot Ancestor was Samuel Bertolett, a Huguenot who helped settle the Oley Valley, Berks County, Pennsylvania in the 1720s. Settlers were of people of different cultural backgrounds -- French, German, Swiss and English. The work ethic, the conservation ethic, the desire for independence and self-sufficiency -- all are deep-rooted here. As a "Pacifist" Patriot Bertolett served in the Quartermaster at Valley Forge rendering medical care to the wounded and providing support services to George Washington's Army while in Winter Quarters. INDUCTIONS (CONT'D)

Compatriot Kanter's Patriot Ancestor was George Tribble. He was born in Caroline County, Virginia in the year 1757.

He entered the Army in 1776 and served in the Caroline District Battalion and was then absorbed into the Third Minute battalion where he served for nine months. He was then drafted into the Virginia Militia under Captain William Taliaferro.

He served seven tours at different times in the Virginia Militia serving at Port Royal, VA joined by Lafayette's army in Culpepper Country, VA and then marched to Charlottesville and Yorktown. At the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown on October, 19, 1781, Patriot Tribble's detachment reconnoitered the county of

Gloucester to prevent depredations of the enemy of the waters of the York and Rappahannock Rivers. He was in one engagement in Gloucester County with a skirmishing party where four prisoners were taken by his party.

In summary, Patriot Tribble served a total of nine months as a Minuteman and an additional five years as a Militiaman. Patriot Tribble died September 5, 1842.

Compatriots Wubbena's Patriot Ancestor was Jeremiah Meacham. Patriot Jeremiah Meacham served as a private in Connecticut under Captain Willis Clift, and Colonels John Durkee and Samuel Wylls. Compatriot Curtis Wubbena plans to visit the grave of Jeremiah Meacham in Burlington Old Presbyterian Churchyard near Burlington, New York during February of 2016 so he can develop his Patriot's Story further.
