- Compatriots Frank and Stephen Rohrbough together with their brother Leonard Rohrbough (Louisiana Society) had a Wreath placed at the grave of



#### GUEST SPEAKER FOR NOVEMBER CHAPTER MEETING



At our November 16th Chapter Meeting, our Guest Speaker was History Professor Allen Hamilton of St Phillips College. His topic was the Battle of Trenton.

His presentation was lighthearted and informative noting that General Washington needed to show some success after his Army had been pushed and chased all over New Jersey before having his Army go into Winter Encampment in January 1777.

Professor Hamilton noted that in late December 1776, the winter turned cold and risky for any campaign to defeat the three Hessian regiments under the Command of Lt Colonel Johann Rahl (Rall) residing in Trenton. With Christmas coming, General Washington met with his War Council to discuss the merits of a night march on Christmas Day against the Hessians at Trenton. With the element of a surprise attack on the Hessian Barracks at 8:00 A.M. on the morning of December 26th this attack might turn the tide of the Revolution for the Continental Army.

Professor Hamilton noted that Colonel Rahl was known for his fondness of drink and celebration. The Hessians embraced the Christmas holiday as an excellent opportunity to imbibe in beer and hard liquor, and the night was spent in boisterous revelry. He noted that many historians reported in their writings about the Battle of Trenton that General Washington's Army benefited by the surprise attack on the Hessian Regiments and made the outcome of the Battle more favorable to Washington's Continental Army.

In reality, a violent snowstorm with blinding snows and driving winds delayed the march for several hours but as they approached the outskirts of Trenton the storm concealed their movement from the pickets who were sheltered indoors. Washington's Army arrived at the north end of Trenton and launched the attack at 8:00 A.M. The sudden eruption of fire roused the Hessians from their foggy slumber. Colonel Rahl sluggishly assumed command of his men and tried to advance against General Greene's regiments but without affect. The efforts at a counter attack failed and Rahl fell mortally wounded. By 9:30 A.M. the fighting was over—some source say the real fighting was over in 40 minutes. Washington had the victory he needed to retain many of his soldiers whose enlistments were up. # FEATURED SPEAKER FOR DECEMBER MEETING



Dr. Amy Porter, Texas A & M University San Antonio was our Guest Speaker at the December 14th Chapter Meeting which was held at the San Antonio Petrole-um Club. Her topic was "The Role of the Missions in the American Revolution." In summary, Dr. Porter spoke on the San Antonio missions during the era of the American Revolution as well as the role that the missions and other residents of San Antonio played in Spain's participation in the American Revolution. She also discussed the impact that ideas of the Enlightenment, which were important in the American Revolution, had on San Antonio and the missions.

To say the least, the subject was well-received by our members and enlightened us on the challenges for the Spanish Settlers in the 100 years plus preceding Texas Independence in the early 1800s and their defense against the native Indians Tribes which included the Apache and Comanche's. Dr. Porter went on to explain how the large ranches surrounding San Antonio and south Texas provided food to the Spanish Army of Bernardo de Galvez as he fought the British along the Gulf Coast from Louisiana to Florida.

For her presentation President Brooks presented her a book entitled "Desperate Sons" by Les Standiford. The book is "A groundbreaking narrative that explores

the role of the Sons of Liberty in the American Revolution. Calling themselves the Sons of Liberty, they gathered together in a radical society committed to imposing forcible change. Those determined men--including second cousins Samuel and John Adams, Paul Revere, Patrick Henry, and John Hancock--saw themselves as patriots. Yet to the Crown, and to many of the Sons' fellow colonists, the revolutionaries were terrorists who deserved death for their treason. In this gripping narrative, Les Standiford reveals how this group of intelligent, committed men, motivated by economics and political belief, began a careful campaign of interlocking events that would channel feelings of vague injustice into an armed rebellion of common cause, which would defeat an empire and give birth to a radical political experiment--a new nation known as the United States."

**Photo At Left)** Compatriot Charles Booker spoke of his Patriot Ancestor Lieutenant James Judge, Sr. He was born in 1756 in Halifax County, NC, and the son of James Judge and Hannah Horn.

Lieutenant Judge enlisted as a Private from April 20, 1776 to November 10, 1778 in Granberry's Company, Halifax Co., NC. Lt. James Judge is found on the payroll of Captain William Brinkley's Company, 2nd Regiment of North Carolina, commanded by Col. Samuel Jarvis.

From the Raleigh Register dated August 13, 1813: "...James Judge, Sr ... died 2 August ... Halifax County on the 2nd inst.,

of a consumption, James Judge, sen. Esq .. ... officer in the Revolutionary War, an old member of the Methodist Society, and of the Bench of Justice ... "

After the Revolution, land was allotted to officers and soldiers of the Continental Line. Lieutenant James Judge was given 228 acres for 30 months service.

At our Chapter Meeting on December 14th, President Brooks presented Service Awards to Officers and Committee Chairman for their service to the Chapter throughout the year.



# INDUCTIONS (CONT'D)

(**Photo at Right**) Compatriot Richard Smith's Patriot Ancestor was Issac Wood who "provided 113 lbs. of Pork to the Army of the American Revolution in Rockingham County, Virginia (Patriotic Service)".

Further research shows that Issac was born in circa 1729 in England and immigrated to Rockingham County Virginia before the onset of the American Revolution. He married Rachael Ramey in 1763. Like most other residents, he was a farmer. He died on April 21, 1803 in Pendleton County, Virginia.

Following the Revolution Issac served in the Virginia Militia in 1787 as a Private in Captain Robert Harrison's Company.
