PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

At our September Chapter Meeting on September 19th, our Guest Speaker was a National Hero — Colonel Thomas McNish, USAF (Retired), a Combat

Pilot, and POW for 6 Years in North Vietnam. Following his retirement from active duty, Colonel McNish joined Biodynamic Research Corporation performing over 2,000 aircraft accident investigations. His remarks focused on specific insights to his imprisonment in North Vietnam sharing his thoughts on coping with life while a prisoner and his future release at the end of the Vietnam War. **More on Page 2**.

(Photo at Right) Colonel Thomas McNish, USAF (Retired), a Combat Pilot, POW for 6 Years in North Vietnam, a Board Certified Physician in Family Practice, Preventive Medicine and Aerospace Medicine, a Pilot Physician, a Commander of 833rd Medical Group Holloman AFB and Command Surgeon, Office of Air Force Reserve. His decorations include the Silver Star w/2 OLCs.

Following his retirement from active duty, Colonel McNish joined Biodynamic Research Corporation performing over 2,000 aircraft accident investigations.

His remarks addressed specific insights of his imprisonment in North Vietnam and his thoughts on coping with life while a prisoner and his future release at the end of the Vietnam War. He addressed how communications were made between fellow prisoner's despite their separation into separate cells. He stated that what kept him going was his faith belief that he would be freed and returned home.

He is currently assigned as the Tactical Services Division Chief and oversees Special Event Planning, the Arson Bureau and the Fusion Center. President Roy Leonard presented Chief Berry with Chapter Good Citizenship Medallion and Certificate.

The Awards Program was planned and conducted under the stewardship of Compatriot Peter Baron. Through his work, 3 outstanding Awardees were recognized with SAR's Public Service Awards as noted below.




Chapter President Roy Leonard recognized two distinguished SAFD Firefighters with the SAR Fire Safety Commendation Medal. They are Firefighters Captain John Flores (**Photo at Left**) and Firefighter Jesse Hinojosa (**Photo at Right**). Captain Flores entered the San Antonio Fire Department in 2001 where he has served in the Fire Suppression and EMS Divisions. Firefighter Hinojosa



entered the San Antonio Fire Department in 2015 serving in the Fire Suppression Division.

Their Citation reads in part: "On the Night of September 3rd, P38 was dispatched to a high water rescue. A vehicle was trapped in high water and inaccessible. P38 positioned its areal platform to rescue two trapped victims from the roof of their submerged vehicle. Both victims were lifted to safety without injury due to the training, expertise, and leadership exhibited by P38. It is this dedication to service and self-sacrifice that resonates throughout the Department. Their actions reflect great credit on Themselves, the San

He has served the citizens of San Antonio as a firefighter in the Fire Suppression Division, as a field Paramedic in the Emergency Medical Services Division, and currently is assigned to the Medical Special Operations Unit (MSOU) on Medic 1C.

Since he entered the San Antonio Fire Department 2007, he has contributed to the success of the San Antonio Fire Department Emergency Medical Services Division. His knowledge and work ethic are a positive example to everyone he meets. Engineer Nielsen's commitment to service is evident in all he meets, instructs, and treats.

He has been instrumental in the implementation of multiple groundbreaking techniques, most recently the advancement of i-STAT capable ambulances. His position on the MSOU has provided advance medical care to multiple responses by the SAPD SWAT, Bomb, and Executive Protection details.

Engineer Nielsen has provided a valued service to the Emergency Medical Services Division. His actions have improved morale and improved patient care which reflects great credit on Himself, the San Antonio Fire Department and the Citizens of San Antonio. Engineer Nielsen was recognized for his dedicated services on the 17th Day of October 2018 by the San Antonio Chapter, of the Texas Society Sons of the American Revolution.



At our Chapter Meeting on October 17th, President


