




PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

Because of the sustained work of chapter members under the able leadership of Past President Roy Leonard during his term of service 2018, these State Awards show well of our chapter fulfilling the goals and objectives of our Chapter, the Texas Society and the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

GUEST SPEAKER AT MARCH CHAPTER MEETING

Our Guest Speaker at our Chapter Meeting on March 20, 2019 was Mr. John Barber — a longtime coin



collector who has specializes in North American Colonial Period Coins and Script — who spoke on the "Revolutionary Period Currency". He stated there were three general types of money in the colonies of British America: specie (coins), paper money and commodity money. Cash in the colonies was denominated in pounds, shillings, and pence. Barber noted that commodity money was used when cash (coins and paper money) was scarce. Commodities like tobacco and beaver skins served as money at various times and places.

The value varied from colony to colony. For example, a Massachusetts pound was not equivalent to a Pennsylvania pound. Also, all colonial pounds' were of less value than the British pound sterling. The coins in circulation in the colonies were most often of Spanish and Portuguese origin. Because Spanish dollar were widely used in the colonies, colonial money was valued in dollars, not British pounds. For his presentation, President Whittenburg presented Mr. Barber a book entitled "Independence — The Struggle to Set America Free" by John Ferling.

INDUCTION OF A NEW MEMBER

At the March 20th Chapter Meeting, President Whittenburg inducted Compatriot Jay Sampson into the San Antonio Chapter, Texas Society SAR. Compatriot Jay Sampson's Patriot Ancestor was Josiah Terry who served as a Private in the Virginia Continental Line under the command of Colonel Charles Lynch. Lynch served in the Virginia House of Burgesses from 1769 until 1778, when he became a militia colonel.

In several incidents in 1780, Lynch and several other militia officers and justices of the peace rounded up suspects who were thought to be a part of a Loyalist uprising in southwestern Virginia. The suspects were given a summary trial at an informal court; sentences handed down included whipping, property seizure, coerced pledges of allegiance, and conscription into the military. Lynch's extralegal actions were legitimized by the Virginia General Assembly in 1782.



TEXAS SOCIETY SAR DISTRICT #3 VICE PRESIDENT VISITS CHAPTER
