CHAPTER PRATICIPATES US MILITARY VETERANS PARADE

The San Antonio Chapter again participated in the 20th USMVPA Parade in downtown San Antonio on Saturday, November 9th. Our Chapter participated in this Parade from 2009 to 2013 when Compatriot Jim Hudson provided his 1952 vintage Korean Jeep and trailer. Regrettably, his health no longer allows him to participate in this event.

This parade celebrates the currently serving active duty members and is held to thank all veterans for their service in years past to this great country.

This year the Boerne SAR Chapter joined us and entered their "Boat Float" patterned after the Iron Ore Boats that were used by General Washington and the Continental Army to cross the Delaware



River and attack the Hessians at Trenton on Christmas Day in 1776. They had eight members of their Chapter participate in the parade. All members who have colonial attire or period uniforms were invited to wear them. The parade began at noon at Ave E Street and East Travis St. The Assembly Area was located on Ave E and extended from 3rd St. to 6th St. and all cross streets on either side of Ave E. The Parade Route proceeded west on Houston St. to Milam Park (near the Mexican Market). This was a great time to show our respect for the service members and their families of the Armed Forces and to honor veterans living and those who have passed. GUEST SPEAKER FOR NOVEMBER CHAPTER MEETING

Our Guest Speaker at the November 13th Chapter Meeting was Command Sargent Major William Manchester, Retired U.S. Army. He retired in 2015 after 30 years in the US Army. He spoke on "The History of the U.S. Army in San Antonio" noting that San Antonio has a rich history of leadership and innovation in civil and military aviation and aerospace, starting with the first flight of an airplane in the San Antonio skies in February 1910 by French barnstormer Louis Paulhan. The first military flight by Lt. Benjamin Foulois from Fort Sam Houston on 2 March 1910 and the establishment of Kelly Field in 1915, Brooks Field in 1917, Randolph Field in June 1930, which became known as "The West Point of the Air". The dedication of The School of Aerospace Medicine at Brooks AFB was presided over by President John F. Kennedy on 21 November 1963. Southwest Research Institute has played and continues to play a significant role in aviation, aerospace, and deep space



exploration and has been inducted into the U.S. Space Foundation's Space Technology Hall of Fame. Manchester currently serves as the Director of the Airman Heritage Training Complex on Lackland AFB. The Mission of the Airman Heritage Foundation is to support the USAF Airman Heritage Museum and other heritage-related activities in preserving and honoring the history and heritage of enlisted airmen. In January 2019 he became Director of the Airman Heritage Museum and is now focused on building the new Museum. For his presentation President Whittenburg presented Manchester a book titled: "American Spring - Lexington, Concord and the Road to Revolution" by Walter R. Borneman.

NEW MEMBER INDUCTION INTO SAR

President Whittenburg inducted Yancey Swearingen into the Chapter during the November 13th Chapter Meeting. In the latter part of the year 1778, there was a call for the Militia. His Patriot Ancestor Lieutenant Van Swearingen Sr. served under Colonel Leroy Hammond, Commander of 4th North Carolina Regiment and Company of Captain Benjamin Hatcher. He provided supplies while serving in the South Carolina Militia. Further, his unit attacked the British picket in their divisions near the Georgia border and after a few minutes of very brisk firing the British surrendered.



MEMBER FINDS ADDITIONAL PATRIOT ANCESTORS

While many of our members use one patriot ancestor to qualify for membership in the National Society Sons of the American Revolution, some do further research of their family genealogy and find other ancestors who performed patriotic service to complete their Supplemental Application.

Compatriot John Lee Jansma became a member of SAR in April 2018 through his Patriot Ancestor John Dunlap. He continued to research his family history and found five additional ancestors who served during the American Revolution. His Supplemental Applications were approved by the National Society SAR and Membership Certificates were presented by President Whittenburg to Compatriot Jansma at the November 13th Chapter Meeting. Compatriot Jansma's Patriot Ancestors include:

- Cornelius Bassett Member of the Committee of Correspondence in 1774
- Matthew Barnum, Sr. Corporal in Connecticut Militia, Lt James Seeley's Company
- Robert Dunlap A private in the New Jersey Militia
- David Wisner An Ensign in the New York Militia
- Elijah Kinne Corporal, 4th Reg Continental Line, New York, Col. James Holmes Camp Ticonderoga Compatriot Jansma has completed another 6 Supplemental Applications that have been approved by NSSAR. These Certificates will be presented by the Chapter President upon receipt.

REVOLUTINARY WAR PRESENTATION GIVEN TO NEW MEXICO MIDDLE SCHOOL 8TH GRADE CLASSES

Compatriot Frank Rohrbough and Lady Diane have given numerous American Revolutionary War Period presentations to Elementary School Classes when their grandchildren were stu-

dents at Double Eagle Elementary School in Albuquerque, New Mexico. At the invitation of Mr. Martin they gave presentations on November 15th this year to all five 8th Grade Classes totaling about 125 stu-

dents at Desert Ridge Middle School in Albuquer-

(**Photo at Right**) Compatriot Frank Rohrbough spoke about General Washington - The Spymaster in Chief. He explained the operations of the Culper Spy Ring which operated in New York City during the period 1780-1783.

Following his presentation, Lady Diane spoke about the Camp Followers of the American Revolutionary War. She explained why many family members followed their soldier fathers, brothers or other relatives to the Continental Army. She discussed what services they performed while in camp.

The Rohrbough's set up their table display show-

ing items that a soldier would use during the War and the items a family member would bring to support a sponsoring soldier while in camp. The table display provided a "hands-on" experience for the students which complimented Mr. Martin's teachings on the American Revolution and Early American History.



FEATURED SPEAKER FOR DECEMBER MEETING

Our Guest Speaker for the December 11th Chapter Meeting was Berta Rodrigues, City of San Antonio 2020 Census Administrator. Her topic addressed several aspects of the 2020 Census.

Rodrigues noted that 2020 is the first census that will rely primarily on internet self-response. Gone are the days where paper forms were available at local libraries and handed out at schools. People will have to either fill out a form online or call the Census Bureau to give their answers over the phone, Rodriguez said. Some census tracts will receive paper forms. For example, if a census tract has a high population of seniors, that mail-out will have a paper form" Rodriguez said.

She explained what is going to happen during that Census process and its importance the governance of our country. Following her presentation, she took many questions from attendees about how the collection of information would be used to align Congressional seats within the House of Repre-

sentatives and allocate federal funding to the States and Districts for the next decade.
