NOVEMBER GUEST SPEAKER CHAPTER ARNOLD ALVARADO

(Photo Left) Our Guest Speaker for the Novem-

ber Chapter Meeting was Arnold Alvarado who served 26 years teaching American and European History as well as Texas History at Southwest Texas College. The subject of his presentation was "The Constitution — its Origins and Framework."

He explained the primary reason the people wanted a new form of government was to seek freedom from King George III and gain individual rights from government. He addressed the problems facing our country under the Articles of Confederation and provided a brief history of Greek democracy and the Roman Republic. Our founder's were very much informed on this ear-



ly history. Alvarado then addressed the writers and thinkers of the Enlightenment and how they inspired the founders.

Finally, he stated our founder's applied all those ideas into the writing of the US Constitution.

For his presentation President Kanter presented him a Chapter Challenge Coin.

DEATH OF COMPATRIOT CAMMID O. ARRENDALL

We were saddened to learn just recently that Compatriot Arrendell had passed last January. We contacted his wife, Marianne, and extended our deepest condolences to her. She provided Compatriot Arrendall's Obituary which reads: "Cammid O. Arrendell, 97, of San Antonio was born in Cleveland, Texas on January 19, 1925. He went home to be with his Lord on January 22, 2022. Cam joined the US Army Air Corps in 1943 and was a Ball turret gunner on B-17, a Navigator and Lead Bombardier on B-24 and B-32.

Cam served as Lt. Col Chaplain in the United States Air Force from 1960 - 1979. During his military career, he was stationed across the United States, as well as Korea, Japan, and Germany. Following his military retirement, he was President of his own company as a contractor for TxDOT. Cam was a proud member of the Sons of the Republic of Texas, and the Sons of the American Revolution.



He was an avid historian and teacher. Cam loved studying the word of God and had a heart for Missions, especially spreading the gospel in Hungary, New Zealand, and Mexico. He was a man of conviction and generosity and gave his life to serving God and giving to others. Cam opened his heart to those less fortunate and helped establish people in ministry through Southern Baptist Theological seminaries. He enjoyed multiple trips teaching at Bible seminars in Romania and Nairobi and building churches in Kenya. Cam also spoke to KGB recruits in Russia and invited them to follow Christ, which they all did.

He was a strong leader, husband, father and grandfather. Cam brightened and encouraged the lives of others with his contagious zest and joy for life, always had a joke to share, and a story to tell. He was treasured by many for his profound influence. Cam made his calling and election sure, and his family carries on his legacy.

He was a lifelong learner having graduated from University of Houston, BBA in Management, South-western Baptist Theological Seminary, BD and Masters of Divinity and most recently Ph.D. in Church History at Newburgh Theological Seminary at the age of 92.

Cammid was preceded in death by his parents, Albert and Ollie Arrendell; his wife, Eloise of 42 years; his daughter, Trudy; and his seven brothers and sisters.

He is survived by his wife of 21 years, Marianne; daughters, Madeline, Kim and Lisa; four grandchildren, Corin Mason (Danny), James Willis III., Rachel Boster (Hayden) and Matthew Willis.

50th Anniversary of Vietnam War Commemorative Event

On November 21st at the invitation of Activities Director Tashua Plair seven members from the San Antonio Chapter SAR visited the Frank Tejeda Texas Veterans Nursing Home in Floresville, TX. The purpose of the visit was to conduct a Commemorative Event to recognize 80 residents who served on active duty during the Vietnam War Era and to "Honor Them and Thank Them for their Service".

Compatriot Rohrbough, as Master of Ceremonies, provided remarks about the United States of America 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War Commemorative Program whose Office is in Arlington VA. This National Commemoration was authorized by Congress in 2012 to recognize the unsung patriotism of our Vietnam War veterans who served on active duty during the period of November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location.

The Texas Society SAR is a Commemorative Partner with the Vietnam War Commemoration Program and were privileged to honor Vietnam veterans and their families in Floresville, TX.

When each Pin was placed on the clothing of the veteran the phrase was recited "A Grateful Nation Thanks and Honors You". The phrase is also engraved on the back of the Pin.

DECEMBER GUEST SPEAKER CHAPTER MATT DEWAELSCHE

Mr. Matt DeWaelsche was our Guest Speaker for our Chapter Meeting on December 14, 2022. He is an Archivist/Librarian for the San Antonio Public Library's Texana/Genealogy Department, located on the 6th Floor of the San Antonio Central Library at 600 Soledad Street in downtown San Antonio.

He has a Master's Degrees in History from Saint Louis University in St. Louis, Missouri, and a Master's Degree in Library and Information Science from The University of Texas in Austin. Matt has worked in the Texana/Genealogy Department since 1995, when the Central Library opened.

He stated that the Library is undergoing extensive renovation and has remained closed to the public. However, much of the resources of the library

remain open via the website where the public has access to research and genealogical materials and documents. He explained that the Library has a vast array of resources through the network of local, state and national libraries and invited our members to use those resource for any family research on their ancestors.

Members who want to use the resources of the Library may do so via the website at https://www.mysapl.org.

Membership to the San Antonio Public Library is free to all Bexar County residents. Access to the digital collections is available 24/7. For information about how to get a library card, visit our website. Two Ways to Register:

- 1) In-Person Stop by any of our 29 locations during regular business hours. Typically, all one needs are a photo ID and proof of current address like an up-to-date driver's license. For more information about how to get a library card, visit our website.
- 2) Register Online To begin immediately using some of our services, fill out the online registration form and then stop by any San Antonio Public Library location within 30 days to present your photo ID and proof of current address and pick up your library card.

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA (WAA) EVENT HELD AT SAN ANTONIO NATIONAL CEMETERY



(**Photo Left**) On National Wreaths Across America Day, it is WAA's mission to "Remember, Honor and Teach" about the many ways veterans have served our country. Those who have passed are honored with wreath-laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery, as well as at 2,800 additional locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea and abroad. Throughout the year WAA works in a number of ways to show veterans and their families that we will not forget — we will never forget — those who have served. This year 1.4 million WAA Wreaths were placed at Veteran Cemeteries across America. Over 2600 wreaths were placed at the San Antonio National Cemetery this year which is the most wreaths placed to date and only 500 short of 3100 grave sites in the cemetery.

On December 17th WAA Wreaths were placed at the foot of each gravestone to honor each veteran for their service. The person placing a wreath respectfully recited the veterans name and states "Thank you for your Service" while rendering a hand salute.

(**Photo Right**) The host organization for this event was the San Antonio Young Marines. It is a local youth education and

service program for boys and girls, ages 8 through completion of high school. The Young Marines promote the mental, moral, and physical development of its members. The program focuses on character building, leadership, and promotes a healthy, drug-free lifestyle. The Young Marines strongly support

the U.S Marine Corps' Youth Drug Demand Reduction efforts. During the Opening Ceremony seven cadets placed a wreath on the ground in front of the presentation platform for each of the seven Uniformed Services.

(Photo Left) The Young Marine Color Guard presented the National Colors for the Opening Ceremony; The National Anthem was sung and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

We joined with the Daughters of the Union Veterans of the Civil War (DUVCW) to order 43 Wreaths this year for placement at the historic San An-

tonio National Cemetery and the Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery.

Despite the heavy rain that stopped just minutes before the event started, the Director of the San Antonio Young Marines organization stated that this was the largest gathering of volunteers to attend this local event since its beginning in 2013. Thus, all 2600 wreaths were placed at headstones in about 45 minutes.


