#### **General Richard Cavazos**

In honor of the coming 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the U.S. Army and the 164<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Medal of Honor, members of four chapters of the Texas Society SAR Color Guard gathered at the grave of General Richard E. Cavazos, U.S. Army retired, one of the most decorated Soldiers in American history. General Cavazos, a native Texan, grew up on the famous King Ranch and joined the Army in 1951 after graduating from Texas Technical College (now Texas Tech) where he played football and was an ROTC outstanding graduate. In 1953, 1st Lieutenant Cavazos earned the Distinguished Service Cross during the Korean War for extraordinary heroism in leading his infantry company in repeated night assaults against a heavily defended North Korean hilltop position. Wounded himself, he displayed exceptional courage and leadership during those assaults and later while returning alone several times to rescue wounded men who were left on the battlefield when his company was ordered to withdraw. His Distinguished Service Cross was recently (posthumously) upgraded to the Medal of Honor and in 2023, Ft. Hood, one of the largest American military bases, was renamed Ft. Cavazos. General Cavazos was the Army's first Hispanic Brigadier General as well as its first Hispanic four star general. Respected and admired by all who served with him during his 33 year career, General Cavazos earned every combat award our country can bestow, and now lies quietly at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery in Section PG, Site 51. Next time you're in San Antonio, take the time to visit his grave, and offer a prayer to this gallant American, a true Texas hero.

The Pilgrimage began in 1918 as a tribute to the fallen soldiers of the Battle of the Alamo on San Jacinto Day. #### **Dueling**

**A Matter of Honor:** Dueling in one form or another has been around for centuries. Duels were often fought over insults, business disputes, political conflicts, or matters of the heart. Often, legal disputes were settled through duels, with the time, place, and weapons, being directed by the judge. Judicial disputes required both parties to deposit some form of guarantee to ensure their appearance.

In some cultures, such as in tribes throughout medieval Europe, disputes were settled by fighting where it was believed that the Gods would intervene to protect the righteous. Knights in the Middle Ages engaged in single combat to prove bravery, settle disputes, or win favors.

The modern duel emerged in Italy and spread across Europe, particularly France and England in the 16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> centuries. It was the way that aristocrats and military officers defended their personal honor. Formal rules, to dictate conduct, included proper challenges, weapons used (usually swords or pistols), and the appointment of seconds, who ensured fairness were established.

The 18th century, flintlock pistols were established as the common weapon, which made duels deadlier. The duel between Alexander Hamilton and Aaron Burr in 1804, which ended in Hamilton's fatality is likely the most famous duel.

Due to changing social norms, legal bans, and the rise of modern legal systems, dueling fell out of favor in the 19<sup>th</sup> century with many countries criminalizing the practice. Some military officers continued dueling into the early 20th century, but it became increasingly taboo.

Dueling was outlawed in the military by the 69 Articles of War, which Congress passed in 1775 to govern the Continental Army during the American Revolution. It was also outlawed in the 101 Articles of War, which was the basis for the military's justice system from 1806 until 1951
