DAR-SAR honors World War II vet with Distinguished Citizen Medal



The Austin Colony Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, joined by the Texas SAR, honored the late Richard Arvine Overton with the DAR Distinguished Citizen Medal. At the time of his death, Overton was the oldest surviving World War II veteran and an icon in the Austin community.

The medal was presented on Nov. 14 to Overton family members by Kate Johanns, Regent Austin Colony, and Susan Greene Tillman, Regent Texas Society DAR, with Gaylon Finklea Hecker. SAR was represented by Stu Hoyt, Wayne A. Courreges Jr. and James Clements.

KERRVILLE - On Friday, July 26, the Texas SAR Hill Country and Southern Command Color Guard of the Texas Society Sons of the American Revolution were honored to participate as the Color Guard in funeral services to pay our last respects to Army Cpl. Billy Joe Butler as he returned home to Kerrville, TX from POW Camp Hofong, North Korea.


Cpl. Butler served in Charlie Company, 2nd Engineering Combat Battalion. His company was overrun by the advancing Chinese forces and he was captured on Nov. 28, 1950. He died in captivity on Jan. 3, 1951, at only 19 years old. His remains were returned home as one of the 50 servicemen returned by North Korea in negotiations with President Trump.

Cpl. Butler received full military honors with services provided by U.S. Army Chaplain Major Scott W. Thompson.

There was an overflow in attendance for his services at the First United Methodist Church of Kerrville, with thousands of others lining the route to Nichols Cemetery, where Billy Joe Butler was laid to rest.







Mustering for Flag Day Correction

The Sons of the American Revolution has long recognized the need to promote Flag Day, June 14. The Second Continental Congress commemorated the adoption of the flag on June 14, 1777. President Wilson issued a proclamation officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day, but it was not until Aug. 3, 1949, that a National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. However, it is not a federal holiday.

Members of Patrick Henry and William Hightower Chapters mustered early to assist AMVETS Post 115 in Kyle to post flags along their fenceline on the street side of their property to commemorate Flag Day. Then they went to visit a veteran nearby who has suffered a stroke and to present a flag certificate to his wife for their dedication to honoring the etiquette established for the American flag as they fly "Old Glory" on a pole above their home. - Stu Hoyt

4. That will open the *_Veterans Recognition Committee_* page. 5. On this page, you can view the PDF file that lists all *Veteran Corps Compatriots* by State Society.
